Chair: We have another great JCR meeting, there will be another one as well so make sure you get your motions in. We had some concerns last time about fairness, making sure your eyes are closed. I'm making sure everyone will be doing that this time. If not, you know what happens, I might send you out.

I'd like to also give congratulations to everyone whose completed their finals or is nearly there. Well done to you! Also, to the sports teams who have done really well; rowing, I know I'm part of that, but there's also tons out there who are in the motions later on.

1. Matters arising

Brodie: I'll try and rattle off anything I can remember right now. I'll probably put out a summary email tonight or later in the week. Some of the big things:

- 1. Bike racks are finally coming! It's a council thing because its outside of college, but they will be here for next term. That is a guaranteed. In the street, there's no place in college.
- 2. We've got formals. Next year there will be an achievement formal. Some colleges have an Arts formal or a Sports formal, so next year we will have one end of Trinity term. It's for anyone who's done well, let's say some arts people got an award or rugby won cuppers. You'd nominate one of your peers to go to it. That will be outside of our remit because we will be long gone by then.

Q: How do you go about proposing a new formal?

Brodie: So, there won't be any more new celebration formals. In the recent GPBC meeting the timetable for next year was confirmed. That will probably be released over the summer or some time. It's similar to what we had this year. The senior tutors don't really want more special formals. It is quite packed now and its one every week/every other week. There are concerns we'd run out of

normal formals – which would lose the appeal. And its extra stress on the catering staff. Of course, the year after, if you want to push that, it'd be the next JCR pres.

Q: Are we still having international women's day formal?

Brodie: Yes, and there will still be and EDI one.

Poppy: And Eid if it falls in term time.

Brodie: Sports reps, how was sports day?

Alex: It was really good!

3. Motions

a. Donation for Bone Cancer Research

The JCR notes that:

- The boat club runs an annual charity BBQ on the Saturday of every Summer Eights week for Bone Cancer Research.
- Bone Cancer Research is an important cause to the boat club after losing Matt Greenwood, a member of the club, to the disease in 2016.
- The BBQ was successful again this year, raising in the region of £700.

The JCR believes that:

- Bone Cancer Research is an important cause that the JCR should support.
- The annual BBQ is an event that should be supported.

The JCR resolves to:

Donate £500 to cover the cost of the BBQ and donate to the charity.

Proposer: Thomas Harray **Seconder:** Erika Dutton

P: So basically, I'm here to ask that we get some money to cover the costs and donate to Bone Cancer Research Charity that we raised money for on the Saturday of Summer Eights.

Brodie: Just a clarification of how this money is done. If you're asking for this from the charities fund, all the £500 will need to go to charity. It's just rearranging your own finances. We can't technically reimburse the BBQ.

P: Yeah, that's fine. We'll pay the BBQ out of our own money.

b. Welfare budget

The JCR notes that:

- JCR Reps for protected groups exist to support students from protected classes. (LGBTQ+ Rep, Class Rep, BAME rep and Disabilities Rep)
- These reps have welfare responsibilities along with the welfare reps.
- Running welfare events is important for student welfare.
- These reps currently do not have any budget to run such events.

The JCR believes that:

- More welfare events are a good thing.
- Specialised welfare events allow for more direct welfare in order to best support students from these backgrounds.
- Reps shouldn't have to pay for welfare events out of pocket.

The JCR resolves to:

- Give each of the reps a £50 a term budget to run welfare events.
- Update the constitution to secure this for the future.

Proposer: Harry McWilliam Seconder: Amy Shaw

P: The welfare team, we love them, they're amazing. They're doing a great job and we would like to do more. Reps like LGBTQ, BAME, Disabilities and Class, we think they should also have a welfare budget. This would be £50 a term, I don't know where it would come. I think that's something we would sort out later. I also want it to be constitutional so its protected. This money would be used for any sort of welfare events. Last week we had a picnic in the graveyard, but because we didn't have any money, we had to turn it into a uni-wide society event so we could have funding. It'd be nice if we could have some Teddy specific stuff.

Q: Just to avoid confusion can we not call it the Welfare budget. Maybe just xxx budget?

Brodie: It won't go underneath Welfare; it will go under the specific role.

Poppy: The BAME picnic they had the other day, what did that come out of?

Brodie: They just messaged me and requested that, and I said sure.

Poppy: Would this be for that in theory?

P: Yes.

Q: How many reps get access to this? Is it 50 total or per rep?

P: £50 per rep, and it's for 4 reps.

P: Essentially, I'm asking for £50 to each of the 'disadvantagement' reps – queer, BAME, class and disabilities. To be used primarily for welfare. It would be a separate budget and a constitutional amendment.

c. Class Act and DisCam funding

The JCR notes that:

- The SU has a number of student-led activist campaigns designed to advocate for students belonging to various protected classes, including RAEM, Disabled, Working Class, and LGBTQ+ individuals.
- The Class Act and DisCam have one Teddy JCR member on them (HM as Class Act x DisCam intersectionality rep)
- The SU campaigns have a very small budget which limits the work they're able to do.
- Thus, all colleges are being asked to give a small amount to help support the campaign financially

The JCR believes that:

- Speakers that are coming to talk deserve to be properly paid for their time.
- Welfare events organised by these campaigns are invaluable, as are the resources provided.

The JCR resolves to:

• Give Class Act and DisCam £50 each towards running events, paying speakers, and supporting students across Oxford.

Proposer: Harry McWilliam Seconder: Amy Shaw

P: Last meeting, one of my motions was to give £100 to the LGBTQ+ campaign in the student union. Since then, I have happened to join two more SU campaigns. I'm asking for £50 for each of those. It'll be going to Class Act — which is for working class students in Oxford — and the disability campaign — which is to work with the DSA and help students socially etc. All the SU campaigns have very limited budget. I think Class Act has something like £175 left for the whole year. £50 to each of those, from the charities budget.

Q: Are all the other colleges also giving money from their JCR?

P: Yeah, all colleges that have reps. In theory every college should be asking.

P: Last year we won powerlifting cuppers. We never got a tankard because it wasn't very organised. So retroactively celebrating some of the few cuppers wins we seem to be getting today. I want to get a tankard for Freddie, whose been a long-time member of the hall. He's served his four years very loyally. He was the captain for powerlifting last year in case that wasn't clear

Poppy: Basically, a few years ago it was put through a JCR meeting that that wall {the one behind the dead coffee machine} is the VPs to decorate. I want to paint it and make it a bit nicer because I think it's a bit dark and could do with a revamp. Make this a nicer space. The JCR resolves to:

• Reimburse Jasper Singh, a member of the MCR, for £100 of his own money that he put towards the Cuppers Winners Dinner, which was enjoyed by many members of the JCR as a reward for their efforts in SEHRFC's cuppers winning campaign.

Proposer: Archie Powell **Seconder:** Alex Burson

- **S:** So, after we won cuppers, as has already been mentioned today, we went for a lovely team dinner, and it was quite expensive. Jasper Singh, who is social secretary of the club, spent more of his own money. We would like to reimburse him £100 for the lovely dinner he organised after our Cuppers success.

The JCR notes that:

- Cool Earth is an Environmental charity that exists to give cash direct to rainforest communities, to fund projects that create choice, tackle the root causes of deforestation, and protect vital carbon sinks.
- This allows the charity to make actual change over larger corporate charities.
- Cool Earth do an incredible job protecting rainforests around the world by supporting the local indigenous communities stave off the greedy knobs that want to chop them all down and turn them into wardrobes.
- 3 existing (Ollie Ogden, Michael Farrell, Matt Moffatt) and one previous JCR member (Felix Gallagher) are competing in the Poles of Inconvenience Rally in July in order to raise money for Cool Earth.
- If the money is raised, we will make Felix Gallagher do the annual Pamplona Bull Run during our trip.

The JCR believes that:

- Giving money to charity is good.
- This money raised will go towards a good cause that is actually making a difference in areas of the world that need it most.
- Teddy is the most environmental college in Oxford and this charity stands for the core environmental values of our college.

Donate £500 to Cool Earth.

Seconder: Michael Farrell

P: This summer after we graduate, Me, Michael, Matt, and Felix, who you might know graduated last year. We are doing this thing called the 'Poles of Inconvenience'. It's a rally during which you aim to raise money for Cool Earth. Obviously, we know that doing a car rally isn't the most environmentally friendly thing. Provide £150 to fund the printing and launch of the annual TART magazine

Proposer: Rose Morley
Seconder: Aminah Dixon

P: Hello everybody! My name is Rose and I'm one of the editors for TART magazine – that's Teddy Hall Art magazine. Last year we had a wonderful launch event to show the magazine and all the hard work from all the wonderful, artistic, and creative people of the JCR. From all across the spectrums of humanities, sciences, and everything in between. So, once again I'm asking you for your money for another launch event. But wait, what about the arts club fund? What about the amalgamated clubs fund? Don't worry, we've been there, we've' done that, there's no money. But crucially we do have a bit of money from the amalgamated clubs fund for printing, we're very grateful for that. But unfortunately, the arts club is all out of money. We love the fresher's artists; we loved your events. So, we would like a tiny bit more, we're only asking for £150 for some food, some drinks – we're not allowed to get that from amalgamated clubs fund, we can only get that from here.
